



Camping reservations are not available at Webb Creek Recreation Area, and seldom needed. Webb Creek has the reputation of being the quiet side of the lake.

## *Webb Creek Recreation Area*

To get to Webb Creek Recreation Area from Ellington, the nearest town, go south on MO 21 to Route H, then east. The road ends at the lake.

Webb Creek Recreation Area is located where Webb Creek and Logan Creek come together. Facilities are on a point on the Webb Creek side of the junction.

If you haven't been to Webb Creek in awhile,

you may be surprised. There is a new beach in a new location, for instance, and additional parking at the boat ramp which makes the ramp useable at much higher lake levels than in the past.

The Webb Creek area is popular for boating, below the junction of the two creek arms, and features some shallow flats above the junction. These are unusual for Clearwater

Lake and give this area its special appeal to fishermen.

The water here warms quickest in the spring, attracting crappie and bass when the spawning urge is upon them. Some hardwood and cedar fish shelters have been installed to make it easier for newcomers to find where the fish are.

All of the new fish shelters put in in 2005 and

the year before were in the Webb Creek Arm of the lake. More were added in 2006 and enlarged in 2007.

The campground faces east and views of the lake at sunrise are often spectacular. Boats going out in patches of golden fog

There are 35 campsites, most with electric. There are hot showers, flush and compost toilets and a trailer dump station. There is a shelter house.
